Historical Overview of RDA

- Anglo-American Cataloguing Rules (AACR) published in 1967
- Revised in 1978, when the '2' was added for the 2nd edition

 The Joint Steering Committee for the Revision of AACR (JSC) was charged to revise and create AACR3

JSC Proposal for AACR3

JSC proposed changes to AACR2 so that it would:

- be a more efficient and easier to use system
- provide improved access to new media types
- be compatible with other standards used worldwide
- make the cataloguing rules international in scope
- be used as a metadata standard so that other kinds of organizations (museums, archives, publishers, etc.) might be able to use it
- be a web-based, interactive interface for presenting information

Beginning of RDA

In 2005, AACR3 becomes:
 Resource Description and Access (RDA)

In 2010, the RDA Toolkit is published





Report: The Functional Requirements for Bibliographic Records (FRBR) was published in 1998



FRBR User Tasks

- Find: locate an entity what is the user looking for?
 Fear Factor
- Identify: confirm entity described is the one being sought written by Paula Mallea, with subtitle: Stephen Harper's "tough on crime" agenda
- Select: choose entity that meets the user's requirements paper format or e-book
- Obtain: to acquire the entity for the user HV6807.M254 2010

FRBR Vocabulary

Attributes – characteristics of entities








Making metadata accessible on the web More granular, so specific bits of data will be searchable Making data usable by humans and computers


Resource Description and Access

- is the new cataloguing standard
- tells us how to record the data we need with new vocabulary – relationships, attributes etc.
- consists of instructions for naming and describing attributes of entities
- tells us what we need to include in records to distinguish different entities
- is compatible with AACR2
- is flexible for whatever the future brings



Hybrid environment

1. Hybrid database or catalogue AACR and RDA records in one catalogue or database.

2. Hybrid record

AACR2 description and RDA access points or Relationship designators added to access points in non-RDA records.

Hybrid environment is OKAY

 We probably will add the new fields (content type, media type, carrier type) to our old AACR records, in order to generate icons to replace the GMD.
