### Comparing the impact of a legal change

### Federal

Create regulations concerning nutrition labeling on prepackaged foods, menu labeling at chain restaurants, advertising to children

Enforcement: Criminal offences under the *Food* and Drugs Act

### **Provincial (Ontario)**

Require chain restaurants, and restaurants that gross more than \$10 million annually, to list sodium and calorie amounts on their menus.

\*Primary impact for costs of health care

Enforcement: Public health – license suspension/revocation

### **Municipal**

Devise a bylaw that would mandate menulabeling

Enforcement: Public health – license suspension/revocation (local impact only)

#### Penalty

(14) Every person who contravenes this section or any by-law or regulation made under this section is guilty of an offence and on conviction is liable, where the rate of speed at which the motor vehicle was driven,

- (a) is less than 20 kilometres per hour over the speed limit, to a fine of \$3 for each kilometre per hour that the motor vehicle was driven over the speed limit;
- (b) is 20 kilometres per hour or more but less than 30 kilometres per hour over the speed limit, to a fine of \$4.50 for each kilometre per hour that the motor vehicle was driven over the speed limit;
- (c) is 30 kilometres per hour or more but less than 50 kilometres per hour over the speed limit, to a fine of \$7 for each kilometre per hour that the motor vehicle was driven over the speed limit; and
- (d) is 50 kilometres per hour or more over the speed limit, to a fine of \$9.75 for each kilometre per hour that the motor vehicle was driven over the speed limit. 2005, c. 26, Sched. A, s. 17 (7).

#### Penalty for speeding in construction zones

(14.1) Every person who contravenes this section in a construction zone designated under subsection (8) or (8.1) when there is a worker in the construction zone is liable on conviction, not to the fines set out in subsection (14), but, where the rate of speed at which the motor vehicle was driven,

- (a) is less than 20 kilometres per hour over the posted speed limit, to a fine of double the fine set out in clause (14) (a) for each kilometre per hour that the motor vehicle was driven over the speed limit;
- (b) is 20 kilometres per hour or more but less than 30 kilometres per hour over the posted speed limit, to a fine of double the fine set out in clause (14) (b) for each kilometre per hour that the motor vehicle was driven over the speed limit;
- (c) is 30 kilometres per hour or more but less than 50 kilometres per hour over the posted speed limit, to a fine of double the fine set out in clause (14) (c) for each kilometre per hour that the motor vehicle was driven over the speed limit; and
- (d) is 50 kilometres per hour or more over the posted speed limit, to a fine of double the fine set out in clause (14) (d) for each kilometre per hour that the motor vehicle was driven over the speed limit. 2005, c. 26, Sched. A, s. 17 (8).

#### Suspension of licence on conviction

(15) Subject to <u>subsection 207 (7)</u>, where a court has convicted a person for a contravention of this section and has determined that the person convicted was driving at a rate of speed of 50 or more kilometres per hour greater than the speed limit, the court may,

(a) suspend the driver's licence of the person for a period of not more than 30 days;

### Note to readers

The Labour Force Survey (LFS) estimates are based on a sample and are therefore subject to sampling variability. As a result, monthly estimates will show more variability than trends observed over longer time periods. Estimates for smaller geographic areas or industries also have more variability. For an explanation of sampling variability of estimates and how to use standard errors to assess this variability, consult the "Estimates quality" section of the publication *Labour Force Information* (71-001-X).

The employment rate is the number of employed persons as a percentage of the population 15 years of age and over. The rate for a particular group (for example, youth aged 15 to 24) is the number employed in that group as a percentage of the population for that group.

The unemployment rate is the number unemployed as a percentage of the labour force (employed and unemployed).

The participation rate is the number of employed and unemployed as a percentage of the population. For more detailed information, see the *Guide to the Labour Force Survey* (71-543-G).

Unless otherwise stated, this release presents seasonally adjusted estimates, which facilitates comparisons by removing the effects of seasonal variations. For more information on seasonal adjustment, see <u>Seasonal adjustment and identifying economic trends</u>.

Each year, the LFS revises its estimates for the previous three years, using the latest seasonal factors.

are instructed to make all reasonable attempts to obtain LFS interviews with members of eligible households. Each month, after all attempts to obtain interviews have been made, a small number of non-responding households remain. For households non-responding to the LFS, a weight adjustment is applied to account for non-responding households.

Sampling errors associated with survey estimates are measured using coefficients of variation for LFS estimates as a function of the size of the estimate and the geographic area.

At the Canada level, the approximate coefficient of variation (CV) can be obtained using the table included in the attached document, by finding the monthly (or annual average) estimate less than or equal to the estimate of the characteristic of interest.
