The Canadian Association of Law Libraries (CALL) is presenting a pre-conference programme for library support staff on Sunday, May 31, 1998 in conjunction with their "Putting People First" Conference in Hamilton.

Performing a good reference interview is a dying skill as e-mail and voice mail eliminate personal contact in the reference process. How do you handle this difficult development?

In the first part of the programme, Joan Pedzich and Kathie Sullivan will advise on this and other problems encountered by support staff providing reference service in a law library environment. They will also consider how to deal with personality types, the level of authority of the client, and teaching/instructing as an off-shoot of reference.

The arrival of the global village means that reference and research go beyond our borders; yet dwindling budgets, time expectations and staff limitations mean we peform reference on the firing line. In the second part of the programme, three experienced reference librarians will deal with answering questions on British, American and Canadian law quickly, correctly and efficiently, with the tools at hand.

The programme will take place at the Sheraton Hamilton, Ballroom East on Sunday, May 31 from 10:00am to 4:30pm. Registration is \$85.60.
