OALT/ABO Presidential Award

The OALT/ABO Presidential Award is the highest honour granted by our Association to recognize outstanding contributions or major achievements made by a member in promoting and/or developing the Association. Past recipients of this Award have truly constituted a "Hall of Fame for Library Technicians" within this Province.

You can imagine my personal surprise and delight in joining this esteemed listing of dedicated professionals when I became last year's recipient.

This award was initially given to Danielle Amat in recognition of the vision and leadership, innovation and achievement, professional involvement, impact and strategy for growth she provided this Association. Since that memorable occasion, all recipients of this peer recognition have demonstrated a high level of commitment both to OALT/ABO and our profession. In fact, over my twenty-three year association with this group, I have found that I have learned much from all of these individuals, as have most of you.

Pat Graham, Linda Davis, Bette Gore, Janet Iles and Danielle all instilled in me over the years a love and respect for Robert's Rules of Order. Judy Koenig's dedicated belief in training opportunities for library personnel in remote locations led to the initiation of a Library Technician programme at Georgian College in Barrie. Judy's passion for post-secondary professional development along with that of Sue Weaver and Marsha Hunt continues to inspire many of us. Paulette Burton, Liz Aldrey and LaRae Moody have provided guidance, and promoted discussion on strategies for setting and attaining career goals, as well as providing practical advice and encouragement on putting plans into action when we re-evaluated our Association during our first "Committee for Change" proposals. Janet Scheibler, Susan Morley, Susan Boudreau and Marg Bushell

have, over the years, demonstrated the need for high levels of commitment to our career, education and our professional community. Truly this Association is blessed with positive role models that continue to provide members with an expanded network of professional colleagues.

In many ways these women are a lot like the rest of us, but they go that extra mile – they are our mentors. It has been said that to advance personally and professionally you should "surround yourself with great people who are very different from you and learn to listen to them." I feel that over the years, like many of you, I've listened and learned from them and their lessons have provided me with the encouragement, skills and expertise to make positive contributions to my profession, this Association, the volunteer sector and my community.

This year the Presidential Awards Committee, consisting of Janet Iles, Doug Wilford and myself met and reviewed the criteria, guidelines and nominations for this prestigious form of peer recognition. Acknowledging the prestige which comes with individual achievement, plus the level of commitment and inspiration required while participating in the structure

and development of projects or programmes raising the profile of Library Technicians and/or OALT/ABO, my Committee would like to recommend the following changes to the nomination process.

In reviewing the current nomination form we discovered that no acknowledgement of a nominee's employment history, personal or professional achievements within the workplace, innovative initiatives within the delivery of library service, or promotion of OALT/ABO is required. These are contributions to the delivery of library service within this province that should be considered in the presentation of this award.

Since former recipients have traditionally been individuals who've inspired other technicians within their career choice and Association involvement, we feel that this Award and its presentation affords OALT/ABO with a perfect public relations opportunity. This could easily be accomplished by the following:

- a permanent listing acknowledging former recipients on our website;
- submission of a press release about new recipients, their professional accomplishments and OALT/ABO to their local newspaper and other appropriate publications;
- ensuring that the award guidelines plus the nomination form are available in PDF format on our website.

Our committee regretfully reached the unanimous decision that we could not award a Presidential Award this year (2001). We recognized that unfortunately our call for nominations did not reach the entire membership — requests for nominations have traditionally been distributed with the winter newsletter but there was no such issue and so the request was distributed only via the discussion list, a communication tool to which not all members subscribe. Also, we know that this Association possesses numerous members who have made valuable contributions to this organization, our profession and the delivery of library service. In other words, we know that there are individuals deserving of this prestigious recognition within our midst. We encourage you to consider their accomplishments, take the time to nominate them and we look forward to not only reviewing their applications but also awarding the Presidential Award at the 2002 conference in Thunder Bay.

Guidelines for the OALT/ABO Presidential Award

In 1984 the Ontario Association of Library Technicians/Association des Bibliotechniciens de l'Ontario announced the launch of the OALT/ABO Presidential Award. The purpose of this award is to recognize outstanding contributions or major achievements of an OALT/ABO member in promoting and/or developing the Association. The first recipient was Danielle Amat, a distinguished member who promoted the importance of professional development and recognition for our field. Her actions continue to serve as an example to those who, like her, demonstrate the importance of Library Technicians and OALT/ABO. Between 1984 and 2001, 16 Library Technicians have received the Presidential Award, which is the Association's way of acknowledging and thanking members for the enormous contributions their voluntary efforts make to our vocation.

The award is presented annually to a full member, in good standing, of OALT/ABO excluding the current Provincial President, members of the Award Committee and past recipients. This award recognizes the contributions of Library Technicians from



- Demonstrated leadership in helping others achieve full participation in the library profession within the Association and/or within the work place;
- Outstanding contribution in building the Association either regionally or provincially;
- Recognized for his/her contributions by colleagues or employers;
- Advanced recognition of the Library and Information Technician profession through publications, seminars, or workshops.

Candidates for the OALT/ABO Presidential Award may be sponsored by two members in good standing, who are not related to the candidate. Nominations must be submitted in writing, by April 1st of each year.
