

ANNUAL MEETING

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

LIBRARY TECHNICIAN COURSES IN HURONIA REGION

Judy Koenig, Louise LaFleur, Mary Davie and other Huronia members are still working hard to establish Library Technician courses in Huronia Region. Judy wrote a letter to George McCaque, M.P.P. for Dufferin-Simcoe asking why Georgian College had decided not to offer the courses. In his reply Mr. McCague stated that "Having received approval from the Ontario Council of Regents to offer a Library Technician program on a part-time basis, the College commenced a review of program viability in relation to available revenues. As the College had not offered any program of a similar nature in the past, a significant capital expenditure would be required. Mr. Busch advises that apart from the provision of a specialized laboratory, an investment of approximately \$10,000 in equipment and \$25,000 in resource materials would need to be made. During 1981/82 the College was unable to allocate more than \$100,000 to total capital acquisition for the entire operation of the College and were not able to consider the expenditure of amounts as noted for the training of perhaps sixty part-time students. Given the necessary climate of constraint, Mr. Busch feels that the College had no choice but to defer implementation of this program".

Even though Georgian College will not be offering the courses, there is a good possibility that courses will still be held in Huronia Region. A meeting will be held in May and further news will be available after that time. In the meantime, if you are at all interested in Library Technician courses please complete the questionnaire enclosed with this issue and return it as soon as possible to Mary Davie or Louise LaFleur. This project needs everyone's support!

PROVINCIAL NEWS

Newsletter editors for the Provincial Newsletter will come from London.

The London Regional Branch will not be reforming as was previously announced.

OALT/ABO is publishing a Procedures Manual and glossary for conventions, for the use of the hosting region.

The job survey is progressing. OALT/ABO Board of Directors will send letters to firms of over 300 employees describing Library Technicians and their capabilities. It is hoped that these job descriptions will make industry and business more aware of our expertise in order to generate jobs.

OALT/ABO is printing a new, up-dated version of our publicity brochure.

The Provincial President and the Public Relation Co-ordinator have been visiting library schools to promote library technicians to future librarians.

Niagara Regional Branch is presently compiling some of the comments made about last year's convention. On the whole, delegates seemed satisfied.

New members to OALT/ABO will receive a new members kit consisting of a copy of the constitution, standards of ethics, brochures, etc.
