Send your registration form in early. Susan needs to let the caterers know numbers.

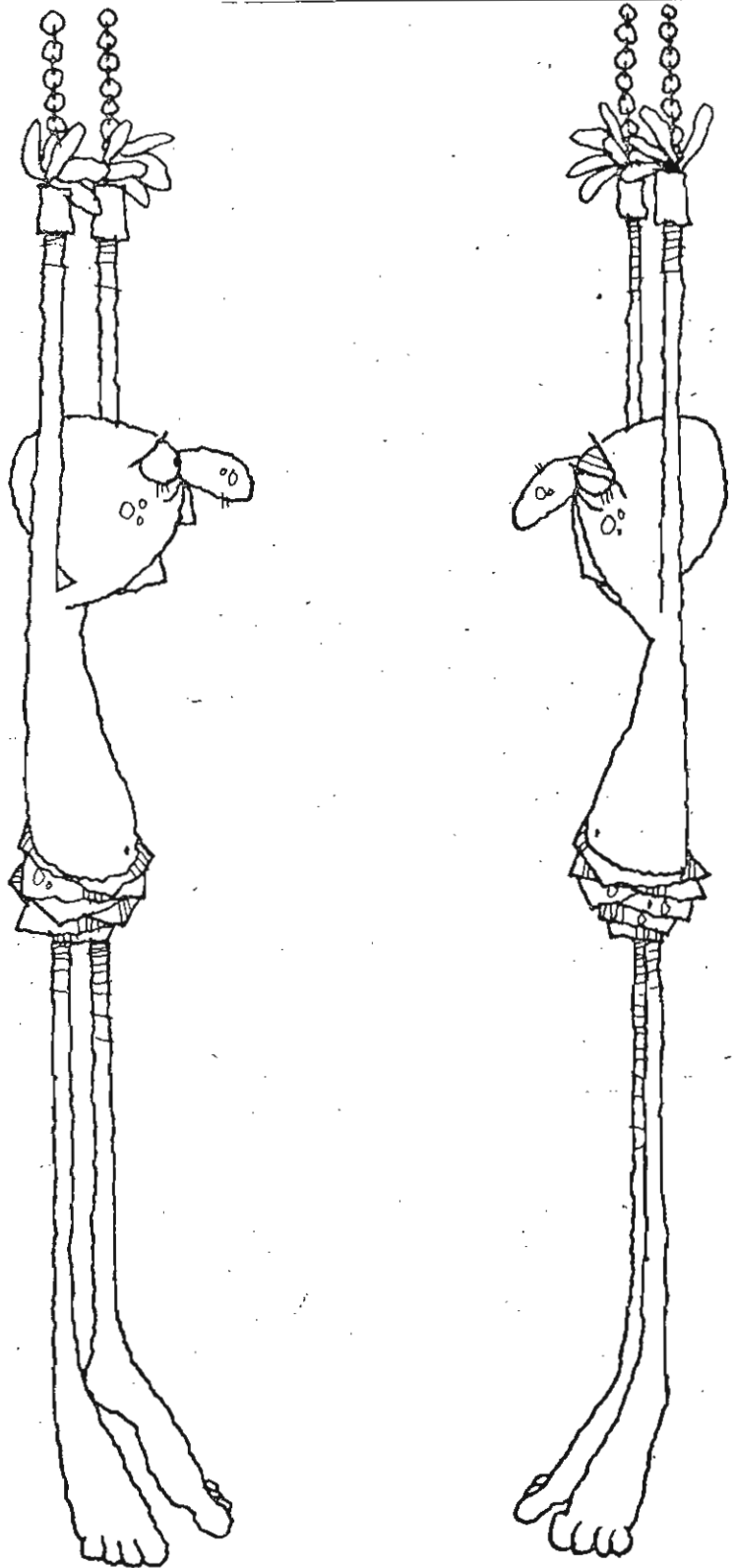

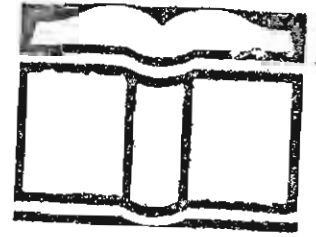
