I am looking forward to seeing all members, old and new, at the annual Christmas get-together in Collingwood.



A very successful Internet workshop was held on October 1st at the Simcoe County Board of Education building. Dr. Tom Stiff gave an excellent demonstration of some of the possibilities for communication and information via the Internet. He told how all the secondary schools in Simcoe County will soon be linked to the Internet. An alternative source of information that is now available to the students is getting communications from the many satellites, which are orbiting the globe. Members present indicated to Gale Moreau who organized this workshop that they would be interested in an intermediate level workshop with hands on experience. Once the board has its new equipment installed late this fall, we hope that a follow-up workshop could be a possibility for spring 1995. As libraries become part of free nets and other networks it is important that we have an understanding of the possibilities and problems posed by connecting to the Internet.

A short meeting followed at Georgian College. Unfortunately, we were unable to host a reception for the students since courses for Library Technicians were not currently in session.



The Orangeville Public Library Board has given the go ahead for the library to begin the automation process. They are undertaking weeding and an inventory of the collection.

Owen Sound & North Grey Union Public Library continue to work toward automation of their library with an implementation of circulation for spring 1995. Chris Carmichael and Janet lles are spending many hours building the database. Recon is being done in-


house by these two using the Syllabus CD-ROM, a database of the holdings of the member libraries of the Ontario Library Consortium. To prepare for automation and renovations the library will be closed for about 2 weeks starting March 20, 1995.

Welcome back Pat Frook & Evelyn Wright. We welcome as a new member Susan Willmer.




Ideas wanted
