STATEMENT OF THE STANDARDS COMMITTEE

as approved at the Annual Meeting May 27, 1977

Definition

A Library Technician is a graduate of a two-year programme of Library Techniques or Library Arts.

Role of a Library Technician
According to the Canadian Classification and Dictionary of Occupations, 1971, produced by Canada
Manpower, a Library Technician has acquired a specialized knowledge of library systems and methods to assist in developing, organizing, and maintaining a collection of library material. A Library Technician carries out functions in any area of the library with little

in-service training, and can be expected to direct the work of other technicians, clerical staff and pages.

Duties of a Library Technician Public service duties

- 1. Reference services, which include:
 - a) giving reference and directional information
 - b) locating bibliographical information
 - c) literature searching
 - d) maintaining information files
- 2. Organizing and using government documents.
- 3. Management of:
 - a) circulation procedures
 - b) audio-visual materials and equipment
 - c) periodicals
 - d) inter-library loans
- 4. Preparation of materials for display and publicity purposes.
- Special services programmes, e.g. children's programmes, bookmobiles.

Technical services duties

- 1. Bibliographical searching.
- 2. Acquisitions:
 - a) ordering
 - b) receiving
 - c) cost management
- 3. Cataloguing and classification.
- 4. Maintenance of catalogue files.
- 5. Computer oriented procedures.
- 6. All aspects of periodical control.

<u>Library Technician Program Advisory</u> <u>Committee</u>

Advisory Committees are appointed by the Board of Governors for each program of instruction offered by a community college. In the case of the Library Techniques Program, an advisory committee is also required by the Canadian Library

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Association (CLA) based on the CLA and Provincial Consultative Committee (PCC) Guidelines for the Education of Library Technicians.

The purposes of the advisory committee are as follows:

- Carry out a thorough survey of the potential regional market for graduate library technicians prior to the start of a Library Techniques Program.
- 2. Advise the program coordinator on curriculum which will best serve the libraries of the area, based on the CLA Guidelines.
- Provide a continuing liaison between the college and employers for ease of feedback.
- 4. Cooperate with the coordinator in arranging such matters as field practice, visits to libraries, the provision of guest speakers, etc.
- 5. Ensure that recommended CLA standards for the college library, program facilities, the qualifications of the program director (coordinator) and instructional staff, and program of instruction, are observed.
- Assist in obtaining scholarships and bursaries.
- 7. Assist in the placement of students for suitable summer employment and in the placement of graduates.

Advisory Committees should meet twice a year and be composed of the following: representatives from employers in the area, professional organizations, other educational institutions, social and government agencies and the like, and recent graduates of the college.

There is much to be done by an advisory committee in order to meet the requirements and fulfill their purposes as listed above. Unfortunately, most of the time at an advisory committee meeting is spent on course content, with little to no time left to devote to the other purposes. Hopefully, as Cambrian's program settles into a smoothly-run system, these other areas will be covered.


