DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Board of Directors and Provincial Executive meetings were held November 20, 1982, January 15 and February 26, 1983. The next meeting will be on March 26th at Ontario Hydro in Toronto.

Following are some of the highlights of these meetings:

a) the president, Danielle Amat, submitted a statement of OALT/ABO's expenses at the January 15th meeting. This will permit the membership to examine how our fees are spent. This report will be available at our dinner meeting for anyone interested.

b) a Presidential Award will be offered by OALT/ABC as of 1983/84. This award will recognize active members who have contributed greatly to CALT/ABO by their achievements, by the positions held provincially or regionally, or by their years of participation in the association.

c) The 1982 membership directory has been printed at a cost of \$1400. It will be distributed the week of March 14th. The BD and PE are considering producing the directory bi-annually.

d) A provincial workshop, the first ever, was hosted on November 13, 1982 at Sheridan College in Oakville. Workshop topics were "Word Processing--What's It All About?" by Vera Coates, and "Library Functions and the Computer: The Integrated, Automated World of the Future" by Dorothy Kew. The closing banquet on Saturday features Stephen Lewis as guest speaker. Extra tickets for the banquet are available at \$17. If you are aware of anybody who would like to purchase a ticket, please contact a member of the conference planning committee.

Saturday afternoon, delegates will have an opportunity to tour Science North or the Big Nickel Mine site. Buses will be provided from Laurentian University to the tour locations.

As panic sets in during the final few days before the conference, we will need all the support we can gather. If you would like to help in any way (registration tables, making signs, selling souvenirs, picking up delegates at the airport or depot, etc. etc.), please let us know!!

The conference committee hopes that Sudbury Region will be well-represented at the conference, and we especially look forward to meeting our out-of-town members who are not able to attend our regular membership meetings.

EVENING COURSES TAUGHT BY SUDBURY TECHS

The demand by employers for more qualified and knowledgeable staff in an insecure and ever-shrinking job market has prompted educational institutions to expand continuing education programs.

Library technicians in Sudbury have certainly felt the need for professional development and have found associations such as OALT/ABO to be an important asset to continuing their education. Evening courses at the local colleges and universities are another source which many technicians have taken advantage of in order to learn new skills. But there are some other technicians who have been enticed by evening courses to expand their horizons in a different manner--they do not attend classes as students but as <u>teachers</u>.

Two such persons are Sudbury members, Linda Davis (Ministry of Education Children's Services), and Bette Heard (Sudbury Board of Education, Capreol High School).

Teacher-Librarians' Course--Nipissing University College in North Bay offers the three part teacher-librarian program in Sudbury. Eve Kendel, principal of the Part II Course, asked Linda Davis to teach the class called "Canadian Materials" during the winter session. Her class was designed to inform the 15 students about the selection tools and authorities used to acquire Canadian materials (print, non-print & government publications). She found the experience interesting & would consider teaching the same class again if the opportunity arises.

"<u>Human Relations Development</u>"--Cambrian College offers this particular course to college and mature students. Bette Heard has been the instructor of the 3 hour evening class, given in 13 week sessions, for three years now. She was trained by a former teacher of that same course who later resigned. The course deals with the process of positive interaction between persons--communication skills, self-awareness are emphasized.

Linda's and Bette's training as library technicians has provided them with the necessary skills for locating the resource materials they need for teaching their courses. Their work experience has also developed their knowledge of sources which can be used to enhance course content and presentation.

Both Linda & Bette have benefited from their teaching opportunities and look forward to continuing in this role.
