## NATIONAL LIBRARIAN VISITS SUDBURY

As a result of a study about interlibrary loan services in Canada, series of a consultation meetings occurred across Canada "to examine in greater depth and precision the various arrangements in place for resource sharing in each province and territory. and how these might relate to national resource sharing activities and programs."

By March 1987, meetings had been held in Nova Scotia, British Columbia, Saskatchewan Manitoba, and Alberta. The for encounter Northeastern Ontario (which comprised of representatives from Sudbury, Sault Ste. Marie, North Bay, Timmins, Hearst, Kapuskasing, Lake and other Kirkland communities) was in Sudbury, April 9-10, 1987.

The first day of discussion place at took Laurentian University, with the wrap-up session happening at Cambrian the following day. College, In addition to Marianne Scott and her assistant, a CISTI representative and one from the Ministry of Citizenship and Culture, there were twenty one participants from various kinds of libraries (special, academic, public, etc.).

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss resource sharing in Northeastern Ontario "its organization, roles, and responsibilities; problems or barriers to cooperation in

sharing documentary and information resources, and future directions."

A wine and cheese reception followed the first day's session. Held at the Sudbury Public Library Auditorium, it was open to all library staff, giving them an opportunity to meet the National Librarian. A videotape was shown presenting an overview of the services of the National Library.

As one of the guests to this two-day event, I discovered Scott to be amiable, Miss interesting, intelligent and sincerely concerned about interlibrary loan Canada's system in a time of fiscal restraint, and the federal and provincial governments' roles in future developments of resource sharing.

One to two participants from each of these cross-Canada meetings will be invited to attend the plenary session, where the resource sharing picture for their province as a whole will be put together and examined. I am sure that those of us involved in interlibrary loans services will be eager to learn the resulting recommendations.
