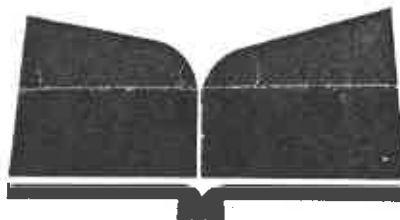

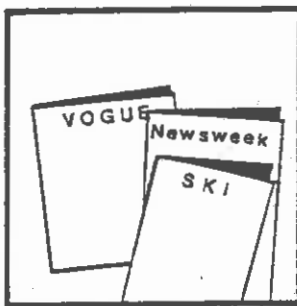
The Sudbury Regional Branch approves the proposed change to the provincial membership fiscal year to September from April.

Profile

Diane Ivany Hynes graduated as a Library Technician from SIAST (Saskatchewan Institute of Applied Science and Technology) in 1987. She has had positions in that province before coming to Ontario and settling in Sudbury in September, 1989.

Her current position at the Sudbury Public Library is with the government documents department and also

includes public and information services at both the Main Branch and the Civic Square Reference Library. Diane finds her days filled with challenges and personal satisfaction.

In a one-person library with Saskatchewan Federated Indian College, Saskatoon Campus, University of Regina, she ordered, managed and circulated print and non-print materials for a developing collection. The atmosphere of a small college library was unique; very challenging and exciting. A family-like atmosphere existed among the students and staff. Diane felt tremendous excitement in being part of a team in developing a special library collection.

Diane held a seasonal job at the Mendel Art Gallery in Saskatoon, both in the registrar's office and in the library where she assisted the librarian in cataloguing the library collection. It was a whole new world! Just being part of the network in organizing and recording data on the current exhibitions as well as those which occurred in the past along with those being booked, was stimulating, interesting and exciting. The library collection was small, but very challenging and interesting in this small special library.

The Saskatoon Public Library in the Fine Arts Department was the site of a part-time position for Diane. She was employed on the film desk where the booking and circulation of 16mm films took place. It was a busy desk with lots of interesting materials and people to work with. The involvement with her patrons was most enjoyable for her.

Prior to studying library techniques, Diane was a R.N. for twenty years. She has enjoyed both careers, but states that her new choice has been very satisfying. Future goals include her desire to eventually get a B.A. and, perhaps, a M.L.S.

Diane enjoys libraries as places to browse and track things down. They're great places for leisure reading. Less positive aspects about libraries include signing for material (actually, there's not many left, are there?) and "negative helping personnel," resulting from a childhood memory. She would like to see libraries with larger budgets and longer opening hours; i.e., seven days a week.

A choice for her to enter the library field was made after attending a career counselling program. Library work was one of the choices that appeared after she participated in skill and aptitude testing.

Her hobbies and interests include swimming, skiing, walking, photography and researching her family tree. She likes travelling and enjoys little adventures that come her way. She avoids stress by reading romance novels; pure escapism that works!

She and her husband have two children, Mark, thirteen, and Kristin is eleven years old. Her daughter

was born in Saskatoon where the family lived for nine and a half years. Mark was born in Newfoundland, where both Diane and her husband have their roots. They go back to that province every few years. Her parents were Newfoundlanders, but she was born and raised in Toronto.

Diane laughingly reveals her deepest, darkest secret is reading romance novels!

In conclusion, Diane praises everyone for being kind, helpful and cheerful, not only at work, but also in this organization. Its been grand!
