#### Report of Meeting, 13 October, 1977

Our postponed general meeting and 1977/78 elections were held. The new executive includes Chairman, Peter Morgan; Secretary/Treasurer, Lesley Prior; Director, LaRea Moody.

The finances from the conference (remember May '76) are complete and the balance divided between the OALT provincial and our bank account. The summary report is included later.

Mr. Alan Pepper, Chief, Northwestern Regional Library, was our guest speaker for the evening. His topic was: The future of the Regional Library. Mr. Pepper centred his approach on the need for any library to examine the needs of the total of its community rather than just the present clientele. He reminded us of the danger within any organization of its members serving their own needs or confusing their perspective with the purpose supposed to be served.

One of the major problems for the Northwestern Regional is identifying these needs of its widely scattered population and the diversity of backgrounds, interests and abilities to handle various types of material. Several of the ways which the library does this and also attempts to serve these needs both for the present and for the future were further discussed by Mr. Pepper and his interested audience.

#### DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Things are really humming on the provincial level, and Thunder Bay members might be interested in the following decisions and activities:

1. Gail Darby, Provincial Secretary, will coordinate all job openings throughout the province. If you plan a move another part of Ontario, Gail will be the person to contact for job information.

2. The Standards Committee, which has been meeting regularly for the past two years, has finalized its definition of a Library Technician, and has prepared a form letter to be sent to all advertisers who show a lack of clarity in their ads for technicians.

3. Eleanor Irwin, our hard-working Provincial Planning and Publicity Coordinator, has been doing a super job of letting the library world know that technicians have a very special role to play. She, along with some of our members from London, Halton-Peel, and TALTA, gave presentations at the U. of Toronto Faculty of Library Science and at SLIS, U. of Western Ontario. Included were two slide-tape presentations made by our very own L.U. graduates--Rosemarie Boucher, Sandra Kratt, Debby Nelson, and Debbie Staber. The overall feedback was very positive. Lenora Aedy, our associate member who is on sabbatical at U of T, finishing off her MLS, reports that the discussion was lively, and that the technicians fielded every question thrown at them with answers that cleared up a lot of misunderstanding.

4. OALT/ABO is sponsoring a booth at the November joint conference of OLA and NYLA at Niagara Falls. Chris Campbell, Provincial Treasurer, will be our official rep, and Eleanor Irwin will look after the booth. A most attractive display has been prepared, along with folder hand-outs.

5. The sale of the <u>Bibliography of Library Technology</u>, compiled by Inge Rakovszky, has been so brisk that it is almost all sold out. Orders have come from all over the U.S., and even Australia!!

6. The 5th annual Conference, to be held at Erindale College in Mississauga, is well under preparation. The theme is ONWARD AND UPWARD: ONGOING COMMUNICATION AND PROFESSIONAL UPGRADING, and the date is May 25 - 28, 1978. So start saving your pennies now. Those of you who went to the London conference know how stimulating and informative the conferences can be---not to mention the benefits derived from meeting other techs and comparing notes. TALTA is so excited about hosting the Conference in 1979 that they have already formed committees to start making plans!

7. Jennifer Singh, TALTA member, has prepared a survey of salaries of technicians in the Toronto area which OALT/ABO is publishing. Copies should be ready soon, and will cost around \$1-1.50.
