


The September issue of the newsletter will inform you on what your executive has planned for the following year. Many of the dates have already been confirmed, but others are still pending. Watch for the annoucements.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT Sep 14, 1985

A number of matters were dealt with at this meeting; chaired by President Janna Munkittrick, and attended by 13 representatives.

1. Fees for senior citizens. Age limits vary throughout the region. The question was also raised about whether a special membership fee should be set for unemployed technicians. Apparently, OLA and CLA have such a classification.

2. Presidential Awards. Loretta Taylor will chair the committee.

3. Conference Proceedings. Because of the large expense of publishing the conference proceedings, it was decided to send copies to all those who attended the last conference, and print enough extra copies to send one to each region and two for the Archives.

4. Newsletter/Nouvelles. The cost of publishing the next two issues will run approximately \$4000. Alan Devine, Roberta Tripp and Kathy Grein gave a detailed report, and also suggested a name change. If the majority of the regions vote in favour of the name change, (vote to take place in TBRB Sep 26/85) the next issue will appear as a new series, beginning with volume 1, number 1. September 30th is the deadline for all submissions for the January issue, and January 31st is the deadline for the April issue. An updated copy of the membership directory will also be included. Advertising and funding are being looked into.

5. Conference Report. Dates are May 27 - June 1, 1986 in Ottawa at Carleton University. Among items under consideration are spending a day working in a federal library, tours of Montreal, performance at the National Arts Centre, visit to the Market, alumni night, dinner cruise, banquet and disco. Approximate cost is \$300.00 including everything except transportation. Mini packages will be offered. First mailing is to go out in October-November 1985. OTTAWA would like a copy of an updated mailing list from each region (therefore keep your membership valid). Among workshops being considered are Stress Management, IBM PC software, UTLAS, Microcomputers, On-line searching, Interviewing skills, How to debate, etc. The theme of the conference is SPECIRUM '86.
