GENERAL MEETING

A general meeting was held on October 6th at the School of Library and Information Studies facility at Lakehead University. Ten members aside from the regional executive attended the meeting. Questions raised at the Regional Directors' meeting in Toronto were discussed and the following suggestions were made:

(1) Question: Is Thunder Bay in favour of a Sept. 1st. deadline for membership renewal?

Suggestions: The Thunder Bay region will continue to keep March 31st. for renewals. Late renewals will be accepted until Sept. 1st. After Sept. 1st., members not having renewed their membership will be taken off the mailing list.

(2) Question: Should we allow expenses to be covered by OALT/ABO for executive if they are not being sent to the conference by their employer?

Suggestions: The executive member should first approach the employer for funding to attend the conference. Consideration should be made to set up a "travel assistance fund". Funds would be distributed as required and as available on an individual basis. It was also suggested that conference exhibitors and advertisers as well as each region contribute to this fund.

(3) Question: Travel costs for Thunder Bay region are now paid 75% by Provincial and 25% by the region (airfare only). Should other costs be paid by the region either the total amount or a percentage of them?

Suggestions: Reimburse the Regional Director for out-of-pocket

The Thunder Bay Region OALT/ABO made a considerable profit from the conference proceeds and we will now have a much healthier bank account! REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Report on the Provincial Executive and Board of Directors Meeting Sept. 10, 1988.

President Maggie Hotchkiss, went over a detailed budget for 1988-89 and is determined to stay within it. She also completed the salary survey and the final results have been published in Newsletter/Nouvelle Sept. 88 issue.

OLA Conference in November includes a workshop by OALT/ABO. Members participating in the panel discussion on November 5th are: Pat Graham (CBC Northern Services), Eleanor Irwin (Can. Centre for Occup. Health and Safety), and Loretta Craig Taylor (Research Bureau, National Liberal Caucus). ABM minutes and annual reports of May 13, 1988 are printed and will be sent to each member.

Newsletter/Nouvelle Sept 88 issue is printed and mailed. This issue contains a summary of Rendezvous '88.

Conference proceedings will no longer be done in the same format as past conferences. This change is due to costs and time. We will receive ABM minutes and reports from Provincial and the hosting region will be responsible for providing a conference summary for Newsletter/Nouvelle's September issue. This will ensure better response time for news of the conference and hopefully the conference treasurer's books can be closed in a shorter time period.

Public Relations Coordinator Pat Graham, is continuing with magazine ads for OALT/ABO. Also, she is trying to put together a fact sheet on OALT/ ABO. We will see a rough draft next meeting. Some of our promotional brochures need updating and reprinting.

Newsletter Editor Pat Kiteley, has done a tremendous job on the newsletter and also on the layout of the ABM minutes and reports. It was suggested to try and get a new layout or headliner for the newsletter. One idea was to run a contest among the graphics arts students at Algonquin College. (Pat lives and works in Ottawa). I will take any regional suggestions to Provinical in November. Discussion of membership renewals took place. This was of concern to all regions, but not all were willing to have Provincial handle membership renewals for their region directly. In representing Thunder Bay region, I gave indication that we would like to handle our memberships and renewals locally. We could have Provincial send notices to our regional treasurer of members who have not renewed and then our local executive could follow up. This allows our region autonomy.

This discussion led to one about regional treasurers. It is necessary for a reconciliation to be sent to the provincial treasurer every month regardless of whether money is being sent or not. Guidelines for treasurers have been outlined extensively, but now with a new appointed position of Membership Chairperson there have been problems of keeping the membership list up-to-date.

At our next meeting there will be a new discussion of this matter and also a resolution of whether to have a deadline for renewal of membership as <u>Sept. 1st.</u> If a member does not renew by Sept. 1st, then their name will be dropped from the mailing list. Currently the membership list is over 620 names but we have less than 400 paid up members. Mailing costs are high. Is Thunder Bay in favour of a Sept. 1st deadline for membership renewal?

TALTA region suggested OALT/ABO form an adhoc committee to deal with reports about Library Techs and bogus Library Tech courses. (eg. Granton Institute). Discussion took place about required attendance of OALT/ABO provincial executive at the ABM. Should we allow expenses to be covered by OALT/ ABO for executive if they are not being sent to the conference by their employer?

Thunder Bay region must look at its constitution as we have a problem with student members. Our constitution allows student membership fees for 2 years only!? Provincial constitution is the same limitation.

A membership directory will be produced this year, after each region has checked its membership list.

Niagara College Library Technician program has been suspended for one year.

Halton-Peel profits were \$2614.58 of which \$1307.29 was forwarded to the provincial treasurer.

Huronia Region is hosting the 1990 Conference.

Lohania is busy planning Kaleidoscope '89 (June 1 - June 4).
