GENERAL MEETING

A general meeting was held on Sept. 19th at the School of Library and Information Studies lab at L.U. Twenty-one people attended the meeting — many of them were new students. After the business meeting was over, four library technicians working in local libraries talked about their positions and the various responsibilities involved in their work as library technicians.

The four technicians discussing their positions were Shawn Allaire, Cathy Walsh, Judy Sennett and Helen Hyvarinen.

Shawn Allaire, a graduate of the School of Library Technology (L.U.), works at Old Fort William Resource Library. The library specializes in Canadian fur trade history and more specifically on the North West Company. Shawn's tasks and responsibilities are to organize the library's collection housed in the East House building on the site. The uniqueness of Shawn's job is that she meets interesting people from all over the world who come to visit the library during their tour of the fort. Shawn also worked at Chancellor-Paterson Library, L.U. as well as at the Instructional Materials Centre, Lakehead Board of Education.

Cathy Walsh is also graduate of L.U. School of Library Technology and works in the library of the law firm, Buset, Eryou & Firman. Cathy's tasks and resposibilities are the organization of the firm's law materials in a unique cataloguing and classification system suitable to the needs of the firm's staff utilizing the library. She spends a great deal of her time providing reference and research services for the firm; therefore, she must be very knowledgeable in the field of law. Cathy has worked for Buset, Eryou & Firman for six years.

Judy Sennett is also a graduate of L.U. library school. She works for the consulting engineers' firm of V.B. Cook Co. Judy organizes and controls the firm's library collection as well as doing other tasks such as organizing the company's project files. The library specializes in construction and engineering information. Judy also provides a reference and research service for the firm's staff and must be knowledgeable in the construction and engineering field. She has worked six years at V.B. Cook as well as working a number of years at Confederation College Resource Library.

Helen Hyvarinen is a graduate of L.U. School of Library Technology also and works at Lakehead Psychiatric Hospital staff library. She oversees and organizes both staff and patient libraries in the hospital. The staff library specializes in mental health resources for hospital staff, outlying district and local community. The patients' library has collection of fiction, non-fiction books and popular magazines for patient use. Helen and Pat Furlotte (library clerk) provide a reference and research service to a very large geographic area and must be knowledgeable in the subject field of medicine and mental health. Helen has worked at Lakehead Psychiatric Hospital library for almost two years as well as six years at Old Fort William Resource Library.
