#### **NEXUS '85**

This year's OALT/ABO Conference, Nexus '85, hosted by the Toronto region was a success.

The Conference was held in two downtown Toronto hotels, the Carlton Inn and the Ramada Hotel, from May 1-4. Approximately 190 people attended the four day event.

Delegates to the Conference especially enjoyed the full day of pre-conference tours of Toronto libraries. Some of the tours were the CBC - The Journal, Osgoode Hall, Art Gallery of Ontario, the Toronto Sun and the Globe and Mail.

Workshops planned for Nexus '85 included business writing, marketing yourself, planning for automation, problem patrons and communications. A panel discussion was held the first day of the conference, bringing together technicians from across Ontario and from various libraries. For the first time, I think, we realized that all technicians have the same problems - our budgets are too small, and we really can not work enough hours to do the type of job we would like to do.

# TALTA JOB PLACEMENT SERVICE

The TALTA Job Placement Service was organized to assist library technicians in their search for library positions. For those members who have never used the Service or for the information of new members the procedure is outlined in the following paragraphs.

It is TALTA's policy that you must be an OALT/TALTA member to benefit from the Service. Members wishing to submit a resume to us must send 5 xerox-quality copies of it accompanied by a covering letter outlining the type of position being sought and the salary expectation. Resumes are kept on file for 9 months unless we are asked to withdraw it from the active file prior to this.

All resumes received from non-members are held for 2 months in an inactive file pending receipt of the membership fee.

Interested clients contact the Placement Service and provide the details of a position vacancy. The resumes of qualified applicants are then forwarded to the client. If interested, it is the client's responsibility to notify you and arrange for an interview. Contact is maintained with the client until the position is filled.

It is your responsibility to advise the TALTA Placement Contact that you have a position, whether it is full-time or contract, as it is important that the files are up-to-date.

Resumes of individuals hired for a contract position are placed in an inactive file until the contract ends. You must send an updated resume to the Placement Contact at that time if you want to be listed in the active file again.

We would like to suggest that everyone continue to peruse the newspapers and call the Ontario Library Association Job Hotline at (416) 363-3380 for position advertisements. Also, it is a good idea to take the initiative and contact possible employers.

Members wishing to register with us must send their resume to the Placement Contact, TALTA, P.O. Box 441, Don Mills, Ontario M3C 2T2. If you have any questions regarding the Placement Service please contact Donna Smith at (416) 784-8484.

It is hoped that the TALTA Job Placement Service will continue to provide a beneficial service to you and to our clients in the future.
