Together this dynamic duo form the Wordsmiths, a professional agency that instructs individuals in the art of public speaking.

After giving us some helpful pointers on speech construction, Fraser gave the audience the opportunity to practice their new found skills in a series of impromptu table topics. Some of our members showed a natural ability in public speaking and the rest of the audience was well entertained by their efforts. The members were then able to hear a well prepared speech given by Arabella on the topic of "Mid-life Crisis". In all, the evening was a good blend of informative instruction and audience participation. We extend our thanks to Arabella and Fraser for providing us with a memorable evening.

SPEECH CONSTRUCTION

Opening

To win favourable attention. Tell audience what you are going to talk about. Get the audience interested in subject. Unify the thoughts of the audience. Set the tone of the speech.

Good Openings:

- 1. Historical reference (recent)
- 2. Personal reference
- Quotation
- 4. Story or description illustration
- 5. Timely reference
- 6. Question
- 7. Straight vivid statement

To develop your points. Do not try for more than 3.

Make them interesting and as personal in concern as possible. OR Develop a conflict and resolve it.

How to deal with points:

- 1. State it simply.
- 2. Demonstrate it. By

An appeal to reason – Give an example – Quote statistics – Quote an authority – Draw a comparison – Appeal to emotion.

3. Recapitulate it. Helps audience to fully get the original point. Say it in the same words or change the words but still make the same point.

Do this with each point.

Summary or Close:

Object is to present main points and draw them together in the audience's mind. You can use:

Anecdote or story to illustrate what you have said. Quotation that makes your speech purpose clear.

A question.

A call for action.

Or a final statement of your theme.

IN A NUTSHELL:

Opening: Tell them what you are going to tell them.

Body: Tell them.

Close: Tell them what you told them.

Ask me to demonstrate anything you do not understand.
