Session descriptions /Descriptions de sessions

Session #1: Opioid Crisis and the Lifesaver Naloxone Distribution Program

Presenter: Jean Terhaar

Time/Location: 9:00-10:15 am / Trent Room

Description: Overdose deaths due to medical and non-medical use of drugs are now the third leading cause of accidental death in Ontario. A significant proportion of these deaths have been attributed to the misuse of opioids.

Illicit Fentanyl is the opioid most responsible for the dramatic increase in fatalities and is 100 times more powerful than morphine. It is tasteless, odourless and invisible to the naked eye, and can be deadly, even the first time. The opioid crisis was declared a public health emergency in Ontario in December 2017. The government is responding, services and programs are in place to help combat this crisis. Naloxone is currently on the World Health Organization's list of Essential Medicines as the safest, most efficacious and cost-effective medicine for opioid overdoses.

Session #2: From Snaps to Apps: Social Media Use in Libraries

Presenter: Jeka Richards and Kiah Russell

Time/Location: 9:00-10:15 am / Sagonaska Room

Description: What place does social media have in a library? Does it have a place in library settings at all? How are libraries in both public and academic sectors using social media to engage with their patrons? Are libraries using this tool to its full potential? This session will examine social media usage trends in both public and academic library settings in an effort to show library technicians effective and fun ways to use social media to its fullest potential, with particular emphasis on best practices for increasing social media presence, patron engagement and community.

Session #3: AWE Books! - Achievement, Well-being & Equity in Books

Presenter: Maria Martella

Time/Location: 10:45-12:00 pm / Trent Room

Description: AWE Books! - Achievement, Well-being & Equity in Books

Maria will present the best new books to engage our diverse population of children. Come hear about picture books and novels that touch on social justice and mental health - books that have the AWE factor! The world is not always a kind place. In our privileged society, we don't always realize the injustices that happen to others, around race, poverty, gender or ability. It's important for children to understand that injustice affects all of us, and that they have a role in developing a compassionate world.

Session #4: Ancestry.ca: Leafing Through the Past

Description: This presentation will be an introduction to using Ancestry.ca. It will cover where to start with Ancestry, including how to access a free version, as well as also go over some helpful hints and tips on how to find your ancestors using several different record types. At the end of the presentation attendees will be able to confidently explore Ancestry on their own and will gain confidence in assisting their patrons with using Ancestry Library Edition.

Session #5: Not All Those Who Wander Are Lost: Serving Patrons Experiencing Homelessness and Insecure Housing

Presenter: Heather Emme Casson

Time/Location: 1:00-2:15 pm / Sagonaska Room

Description: This program will explore small and achievable ways to acknowledge and provide service to patrons experiencing homelessness and insecure housing. Surveyed via the lens of lived experience and cognizant of the complexities of this challenge, it is about subtle shifts in perspective and changes that can be achieved using existing tools.

Session #6: Book Repair with Carr McLean

Presenter: Chad Martin

Time/Location: 2:45-4:00 pm / Sagonaska Room

Description: Book repair can be a daunting adventure when you've never attempted it. Together we will go over a variety of techniques and methods of the most common issues with damaged books. A variety of tools and materials will be demonstrated to show you how easy and rewarding repairing books can be. Preventative techniques will also be shown so you can prepare your books before being released to your patrons with the intention of extending their lifespan, while reducing the chances of future damages. The goal is for you to walk away knowing that book repair is much easier than you may think.

Session #7: Capturing Creativity Digitally

Presenter: Andrea Kerr

Time/Location: 9:00-10:15 am / Sagonaska Room

Description: What does creativity mean to you and your patrons? Creativity is a catalytic global competency essential to the path toward innovation. In this session, we will rethink common assumptions about creativity and slow down to think deeply about what it means to ideate, prototype, and iterate within digital spaces. We will do creative work while honing our app smashing skills, so please bring a mobile device. You will come away from this session with ideas for enhancing your own creative life and for creatifying programming in your library.

Session #8: Poetry in the Library

Presenter: Sarah Emtage

Time/Location: 9:00-10:15 am / Trent Room

Description: Spoken word, sonnets, free-verse, epics, limericks-- there's poetry out there for everyone! Find out how you can use this monolithic literary form to benefit your library and its patrons. This session includes:

- 1. A brief overview of the different types of poetry in your collections
- 2. Ideas and resources for creative and engaging poetry displays and programs
- 3. Tips for reading and performing poetry (whether it's Byron or a rhyming picture book)
- 4. And the performance of some library-themed poetry from Sarah's new book.

Session #9: Wellness at Work: Ergonomics at Your Workstation and Other Tips!

Presenter: Shaena Dearman

Time/Location: 10:45-12:00 / Sagonaska Room

Description: We will walk through the standard ergonomic risk factors of seated, clerical work and the principles for improving the workstation. We will perform stretch breaks and discuss other wellness techniques to prevent illness related to our work.

Description: Participants will enjoy a brief puppet show, followed by a discussion about Puppets/Puppet shows and how to write a script, and make their own paper bag puppet.

Session #11: Bouncing Babies

Description: Join Janna and Heather and baby LEO for a musical storytime and a discussion about the importance of programs and music in babies' lives. We will discuss the type of music and teach a few routines.

Session #12: What is happening in the world of cataloguing?

Description: We are rapidly moving into a new cataloguing landscape. There is a lot of talk about big changes to RDA, about linked data and Bibframe. This session is not a "how to" session but an update on new directions to prepare library staff for changes in the near future.

This session will give an overview of recent developments in cataloguing, highlighting important new directions for our content standard, RDA, and looking at how linked data fits into this landscape. It will also touch upon the question of Bibframe as the replacement for MARC.

Session 13: Documents, Certificates & Lesson Plans--Oh My! Part ONE

Description: In this session we'll be using Google Forms, Docs, Sheets, Slides and an add-on called Form Publisher. We will create forms to collect specialized data including uploaded images, video and documents and, with the help of our add-on too, we will publish the data into automatically generated, beautiful-looking publications. By taking the time to design a template, you'll never have to create another certificate for your library again.

Session #16: Laughter Yoga

Description: Laughter Yoga is a unique concept of laughing without waiting for jokes, humour or comedy. It's about laughing because laughing feels good and it's good for us! It does not involve any actual yoga poses (at least not on purpose!) but it does use deep breathing techniques used in yoga practice. In addition to deep breathing and laughter exercises, a Laughter Yoga session may include singing, dancing and acting silly. Group dynamics make this activity fun, spontaneous and contagious. There is no right or wrong in Laughter Yoga and everyone can do it!
