On Thursday night we will be going to Oh Canada 'Eh for a dinner/theatre experience. We will be traveling by bus (paid for by OALT/ABO) from the hotel to the theatre; leaving the hotel at 5:45 p.m. and will return to the hotel after 9 p.m. to the hotel. This experience will be paid for by you. If you wish to just go to the theatre there is a pro-rated cost. The WEGO bus goes directly there from across the road from the Best Western Cairn Croft, if you want to go on your own.

Friday workshops will be hosted by the Niagara Falls Public Library at their main branch on Victoria Avenue. Box lunches will be supplied by the Hotel. We will contact you about what your choices are, and they will be delivered to the Library.
