To ensure access to a coordinated diverse range of affordable quality services and supports for young children and families residing in Niagara.


Services we offer to young children and families:

- Children's Services is the Systems Manager for Early Years Services
- Provide financial assistance for eligible families
- Offer online registration for child care fee subsidy and resource teacher supports
- Support for children who may be at risk of a developmental delay or have diagnosed special needs



# Niagara Region Children's Services


### Children's Services funds child care for the Niagara Region



There are 180 licensed child care centres in Niagara Region

7 Region Niagara

In Niagara, there are 11,500 child care spaces for children birth to four (all day) & before and after school for children 4-12 years of age



Child Care must be licensed by the provincial government if there are more than 5 children being cared for





# Niagara Region Children's Services provides:

### Financial assistance for eligible families

- Child care subsidy covers all or part of the costs of child care for children up to 12 years of age in licensed programs.
- The amount of subsidy is based on income level and confirmation of the reason for care.

We provide financial help to eligible families to assist with the costs of:

- Licensed child care
- Seasonal camps
- Sports and culture programs (ProKids)
- Resource consultants to support healthy child development
- Behaviour consultant supports




# Financial Assistance Eligibility Requirements

- Be a resident of Niagara
- Have a child 12 years old or younger
- Provide the most recent Canada Revenue Agency Notice of Assessment or Canada Child Benefit and Ontario Child Benefit notice.

Eligibility will be determined at an interview that includes an income test. If eligible for financial help, a placement plan for the child's care will be developed.







Niagara Region Children's Services is also a licensed agency with contracts with Home Child Care providers across Niagara for children from birth-12 years of age.









EarlyON Child and Family Centres provide free, high-quality drop-in programs for children from birth to six years of age, their parents and caregivers.

Our centres are family-focused and offer a welcoming and fun space for Niagara's children to learn, play, and connect with others.


Parents and caregivers stay with their child(ren) and together experience the many benefits these centres provide.



#### What is Emotional Maturity?

Emotional Maturity is the domain of child development that encompasses children's emotional state, skills and responses. Children who are vulnerable in this domain are more likely to have difficulties later in life.

#### **Emotional Maturity includes four subdomains**

#### **Prosocial and Helping Behaviour**

- · Comforts a friend who is crying or upset
- · Offers to help others
- · Will try stop quarrels

#### **Anxious and Fearful Behaviour**

- Cries a lot
- · Incapable of making decisions
- Unhappy/sad/depressed
- Appears anxious or fearful

#### Hyperactive and Inattentive Behaviour

- · Has trouble sticking to any activity
- · Is impulsive/acts without thinking
- Has difficulty awaiting their turn in a game


#### **Aggressive Behaviour**

- · Bullies or is mean to others
- Kicks/bites/hits
- · Laughs at the discomfort of other children





Mindfully selected items to help positively impact social emotional behaviours in the home




Nanette's Baguette follows the relationship we all develop of food to development and emotional satisfaction
