

SALARY & LIBRARY SURVEY 2020 | OALT/ABO



OVERVIEW

In 2020, OALT/ABO conducted a Salary and Library Survey to determine benchmark employment remuneration, standards, and trends concerning Library Technicians. The last salary and library survey was carried out in 2017.

This year's analysis is based on 138 responses to the English survey and 4 responses to the French survey.


All questions were optional and not every respondent answered each question. Some questions were asked per job, so respondents reporting more than one library-related position submitted multiple answers. There were 12 respondents who indicated having two library-related positions, while no respondents reported a third position.

The average respondent to the survey is a Library Technician with a Library Technician diploma in addition to another degree(s) and/or diploma(s) and earns approximately between \$43,000 and \$47,000 per year.

The majority of respondents to the survey are employed on a full-time, permanent basis and are paid bi-weekly, with some form of benefits.

Respondents indicated working in a variety of cities across Ontario, with the highest concentration located in Ottawa and the surrounding area or Toronto and the surrounding area.


LANGUAGE PREFERRED (SPOKEN AND WRITTEN)




YEARS EXPERIENCE








LANGUAGE PREFERRED (SPOKEN AND WRITTEN)






WHAT LIBRARY/INFORMATION-RELATED ASSOCIATION(S) DO YOU BELONG TO?




HOW MANY ASSOCIATIONS DO YOU BELONG TO?




Many respondents indicated a job title that did not include the term "Library Technician", though many titles included the term "Technician". Below are some examples of various titles that appeared several times.





HOW SALARY IS NEGOTIATED
























IS TRAVEL REQUIRED FOR YOUR JOB?




CHANGES IN YOUR POSITION IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS











TYPES OF SPECIAL LIBRARY

WHO IS IN CHARGE OF YOUR LIBRARY?




The majority of respondents indicated they work in a School Library.

A large majority of respondents work in a Library run by either a Library Technician or a Librarian.



Almost 90% of respondents indicated that their library uses an automated system for cataloguing/circulation.


The most commonly used systems were Insignia, SirsiDynix, and Ex Libris.


















